






Demographics: Race/Ethnicity

by percentage of respondents








Q2. FOUR Parks and Recreation Facilities That Respondent Households Visit Most Often

by percentage of respondents who selected the item as one of their top four choices








Q3. Physical Condition of ALL Parks, Trails and Recreation Facilities Operated by the M-NCPPC in Prince George's County

by percentage of respondents (excluding "not provided")








Q4. ALL the Ways Respondent Households Travel to Parks and Recreation Facilities

by percentage of respondents (multiple choices could be made)





Q5. Have you or other members of your household participated in any recreation programs offered by the M-NCPPC in Prince George's County during the past 12 months?



Q5b. THREE Primary Reasons Why Households Have Participated in Prince George's County Programs or **Recreation Activities**





by percentage of respondents (excluding "not provided")








Q8. Parks and Recreation FACILITIES That Households Have a Need For



Q13. Have you or members of your household visited or used any of the community centers operated by the M-NCPPC in Prince George's County during the past 12 months?










Q16. Maximum Amount of Time Households Would be Willing to Drive to Use a Multi-Use Community Recreation Center










Q20. Ways in Which Respondents Would Allocate an Additional \$100 Among the Following Categories



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Recommendations







Recommendations: Overall System

Established Facility Locations Standards for:

- Developed , developing and rural tiers
- Tailor facilities to neighborhood and community conditions
- Maintenance/support, e.g. aligned with facility use and condition.





Recommendations: Overall System

- Use a comprehensive set of cost/benefit criteria to prioritize capital investments in existing and new facilities and infrastructure
- Diversify funding sources outside of taxes through earned income from facilities, foundations/ conservancies, and sponsorships
- Develop fair and equitable partnerships





Recommendations: Land

- Update Developer Contribution to Park System via "Land Dedication"
- Add a tool to increase park and recreation facilities during the development process
- Establish an aggressive program to add 200 miles of new trails





Recommendations: Facilities

- <u>Maintain What We Have</u>: Establish a policy to set an annual reinvestment of money to protect assets and for preventative maintenance and replacement costs
- <u>Create Signature Facilities</u>: Define a vision and criteria for developing one or more signature parks, attractions, and special events
- <u>Provide Richer Recreational Experiences</u>: Provide richer recreational experiences for all Prince Georgians through development of larger and sustainable multi- generational facilities and include aquatics as part of the experience





Recommendations: Programs

- Establish a System to Identify the level of Tax Subsidy for Program Services
- Establish a Pricing Policy to Address Essential, Important and Value Added Services
- Tie all programs to connectivity, economic development, and health and wellness goals
