

## **GRAB YOUR GEAR AND GO BIRDING!**

On the Anacostia River, **Bladensburg Waterfront Park** continues to shine as a fall birding hotspot, with eBird listing **197+ species** for the location.


Notably, this year has seen some eye-catchers: a **small flock of American Avocets** turned up—a rare visitor—and a **pair of Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks** made waves among local birders. They also attest to the continued improvement of water quality in the Anacostia River.

Stroll down the Anacostia River Trail, which passes through shrubby fields and the **Bladensburg Wetlands** – excellent habitat for migrating **songbirds**, **sparrows**, and **marshland birds**. As the Anacostia River is tidal at this point, there are usually **mud flats** visible at low tide, offering feeding and resting habitat for **gulls**, **terns**, and **shorebirds**. Late-summer into October brings pulses of migrating **warblers**, **swallows**, **thrushes**, and **raptors** riding cool fronts downriver. **Waterfowl** will show up as the season matures.

For birders and non-birders alike, Bladensburg Waterfront Park delivers as a place of unexpected adventures and experiences.

Since 2022, Matthew Payne, a graduate student from the University of Maryland, has been serving as a Naturalist at Bladensburg Waterfront Park. In 2023, he initiated a project to document mammals in the park using motion-activated trail cameras. This project was designed to provide consistent, non-invasive data about the diversity of wildlife inhabiting the park's wetlands and surrounding woodlands.

Over the years, the trail cameras have revealed a surprising amount of wildlife. Among the animals recorded are beavers, white-tailed deer, and coyotes. Perhaps most striking were the appearances of river otters, a species that was once rare or absent from the region due to habitat loss and pollution. The appearance of these mammals demonstrates that the ecosystem of Bladensburg Waterfront Park is thriving.

The presence of top predators, such as coyotes, and sensitive species, like otters, indicates that water quality, food availability, and habitat suitability have improved significantly. This research is a testament to the resilience of nature and the impact of restoration efforts along the Anacostia River. This research also highlights the essential role of careful monitoring in understanding urban ecosystems and appreciating the wildlife that quietly shares our landscapes.
